HCA Statement of Faith

HCA's Statement of Faith is the foundation of the HCA community of families. Parents, students and teachers must ascribe to these core beliefs in order to participate in HCA. Denominational doctrines will not be taught nor discussed while at HCA.

1. Salvation: We believe that all men are sinners by nature and by choice and are, therefore, under condemnation. We believe that those who repent of their sins and trust in Jesus Christ as Savior are made new by the Holy Spirit.
2. The Word of God: We believe that the Bible is the Word of God, fully inspired and without error, written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, and that it has supreme authority in all matters of faith and conduct.
3. The Trinity: We believe that there is one living and true God, eternally existing in three persons — Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. These three are equal in power and glory, working separately, yet together, in the work of creation, providence and redemption.



HCA Parent Responsibilities

- Parents are responsible for the behavior of their children and teaching them to uphold the HCA's policies. Before applying for membership in HCA, each family must become familiar with and agree to follow the HCA Handbook, Student Protection Policy, Fees, Tuition, Payment & Refund Policy, Statement of HCA Membership Commitment and any and all other HCA policies.
- Parents agree to check email daily. Email is the primary method of communication for HCA. Important announcements and any necessary changes are announced via email.
- Parents agree to keep their family information, especially their contact information, up to date on the website and with the Supervisors.
- Parents need to research the requirements of each class before enrolling children to ensure that their children can fully participate without special accommodation. HCA is not a school and therefore does not have adequate resources to meet individual instructional needs. Parents may not attend classes to assist their children.

HCA Student Responsibilities

- Students agree to adhere to the rules outlined in the HCA Handbook and all HCA policies, as well as any classroom rules put forth by their individual teachers.
- Students agree to show respect to their teachers, supervisors, and adults in position of authority while attending HCA classes or functions.
- Students agree to be good stewards of the SAYSF facility.
- Students will complete their assigned work to the best of their ability and in a timely manner.

Apply for HCA Membership

When you are ready to apply for membership, visit For New Families under our Membership tab. When the website is open to membership applications, you will be able to click through to the application. Once there, a checklist process will guide you through a series of forms that provide essential family data and detailed information about each child who will be enrolled. The answers to these questions help ensure that your family's goals and HCA's class setting are mutually compatible.

After HCA membership is approved, you will be notified via email when Open Registration and Enrollment will begin.
